In Honor of Black History Month

The U.S. women's suffrage movement had its roots in the abolition movement.

Facts about Sojourner Truth

~ Isabella Baumfree was born a slave in NYS in 1797. She changed her name in

1843 to *Sojourner Truth* because she told friends, "The Spirit calls me, and I must go" then traveled and preached about the abolition of slavery.

- ~ She spoke only Dutch until she was 9.
- ~ She was sold 4 times and had at least three of her children sold away from her. She escaped with her infant daughter in 1826.
- ~ She was the first black woman to win a court case against a white man in 1828 to recover her son.
- ~ She campaigned for abolition and women's rights, and is well known for her speech, "Ain't I a Woman?" at the 1851 Women's Convention in Akron. Ohio.
- ~ The reverse side of the new \$10 bill will honor Sojourner Truth along with Susan B. Anthony, Alice Paul, Elizabeth Cady Stanton and Lucretia Mott who were instrumental in the passage of the 19th Amendment.
