GUN CONTROL-WHY NOT?

The debate between gun control advocates and gun rights advocates is still being argued in the media and on the floor of the United States Congress. According to the gun rights advocates, those in favor of stricter restrictions for gun ownership want to abolish the second amendment. No one wants to deprive hunters, target shooters, gun collectors from ownership. The second amendment is not in danger of being rescinded, but the right of life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness is being denied to many Americans killed every day by gun violence. How many more first graders, police officers, innocent people walking down a street have to be killed before our representatives decide to act on the side of protecting the American people?

The Pew Research Center showed that politically 85% of Democrats and 55% of Republicans support a federal database track gun sales. In May 2013, the U.S. Senate rejected the Manchin-Toomey bill to extend background checks to internet and gun show sales. How did this bill endanger our second amendment rights? Gun rights advocates slogan is "Guns don't kill, people However, irresponsible people with do". guns do kill people. Statistics show that most murders occur because a gun was available. Most murders are committed by the use of guns as opposed to knives etc. Legal guns often are stolen from homes, cars or trucks by criminals.
