PRESIDENTS' MESSAGE



As 2017 draws to a close, we look back on a tremulous year in women's rights. AAUW has been foremost in this fight. AAUW was one of the sponsors of the Women's March on Washington in January in which some of our members participated. The National Convention in Washington D.C. addressed a number of issues including Student Loan Debt and Protecting Title IX. The 2017 AAUW research, **Deeper in Debt: Women and Student Loans**, shows that a lot of women struggle with their student debt. We also know that women and girls continue to face discrimination in schools. Other important issues include addressing sexual assault, promoting STEM careers for women, advocating for pay

equity and continued advocacy. Our dues seem high but when we all work together, under the AAUW banner, we make a bigger impact and have a louder voice on the issues that affect women and girls and thus we all gain in the end. AAUW is doing the work with our help. The combination of national, state and local work is what makes being a member of AAUW so powerful and special – we can be the change makers of our communities and our nation. Locally we are initiating two AAUW sponsored programs, Start Smart and Work Smart and hoping to continue our support of sending a student to The National Conference for College Women Student Leaders (NCCWSL). The Work Smart training is for women already in the work force who want to improve their position and salary as well as for women who want to get back into the work force. Hello everyone! My name is Subha and I am a junior at the University at Albany. This previous summer I was able to attend AAUW's National NCCWSL because of the generosity of the AAUW Schenectady branch and it was an experience I will never forget. There is something really beautiful about being surrounded by women from all over the nation, to

come together and reinvigorate our selves with ideas for change. It was empowering to hear stories from other women and learn about how they had conquered their adversity with positivity and grace. My favorite aspect of NCCWSL was the welcoming atmosphere that was present, and how everyone was willing to learn from what was being presented. I personally really enjoyed a workshop that was called "Mindfulness as Resistance" because everyone in that room left with insight on how to self-reflect on what was important for their future goals. I was also extremely inspired by the amazing women of distinction, one being Amanda Nguyen, who is a graduate of Harvard University and the founder of RISE, a national civil rights non-profit, geared towards helping survivors of sexual assault. After graduation, I plan on attending law school and one of my goals has always been to help victims of human trafficking through advocacy. Hearing Amanda Nguyen speak on her experience helped to inspire and motivate me to keep working so I could one day impact thousands of young girls, just as she has through her organization.
