

Membership Dues Update: AAUW

The AAUW Board of Directors voted in June 2017 to enact the first **dues** change in almost a decade. Effective March 16, 2018, national **dues** will **increase** from \$49 to \$59. Annual **dues** currently account for 13 percent of AAUW's annual budget. They help to sustain and grow AAUW's programs ...

RENEW BY MAY 16 AND SAVE \$\$

Songs for Suffrage, Voices for Votes

In honor of the passage of Women's Suffrage in New York State in 1917 the Thursday Musical Club women's chorus will present a concert in the Carl B. Taylor Auditorium at Schenectady County Community College on April 11 at 7 pm. The Thursday Musical Club is directed by our own Julie Panke.

Guest artists will include Totally Pitchin', the student a cappella chorus at SCCC that sang at AAUW's Christmas luncheon. A prologue to the concert will be presented by Dawn Standing Woman of Mohawk/Turtle Clan heritage and Eric Marczak, specialist in Native American flutes, illustrating the influence of the Mohawk culture to the suffrage movement. Historical songs from the British suffrage movement will be included as well as contemporary pieces and a musical setting of Sojourner Truth's speech at the Ohio Women's Rights Convention in 1851, "And Ain't I a Woman".

A reception and networking event following the concert will include representatives from several local organizations: the SCCC student club of the American Association of University Women, The Schenectady County League of Women Voters, Girl Scouts of USA, and YWCA of Northeastern NY. Tickets are \$15 for adults and \$12 for seniors/students and available from the Thursday Musical Club members and at the door.
