A Message from our Board

Since 1881 AAUW has been an articulate voice in the struggle for women's rights. Never has this mission been more important than right how. AAUW works to advance gender equity for women and girls by advocating for policies which target educational and economic barriers. Their research has been groundbreaking and has included: The simple truth about the Gender Pay Gap, Deeper in Debt: Women and student Loans, Broken Ladders: Barriers to Women's Representation in Nonprofit Leadership and other areas of leadership opportunities, the underrepresentation of girls in STYEM classes and women in science and engineering jobs, and Sexual Harassment. "Through new and traditional media, targeted outreach to policymakers, and member efforts, AAUW research serves as a catalyst for actions."

Part of our local mission has been to provide opportunities to local college women so that they can access and benefit from the leadership training AAUW provides. Not only have we been able to provide scholarships to one student each year for 4 years to attend AAUW's National Conference for College Women Student Leaders (NCCWSL), we also have contributed to SCCC's 3-year AAUW's START SMART license to give their students strategies on how to negotiate for better salaries and benefits. It is impressive to read a Visions article or hear from these young women (2 of these students did a presentation at our District IV conference several years ago) about the impact these AAUW training workshops and conferences have had on their lives.

We have been proactive in empowering local college students and now have AAUW student clubs at SCCC and Union College. We are very cognizant of the imperative that we train, educate and empower the next generation of women to step up to the challenge to achieve true economic and political parity. You can be part of this effort by financially contributing to our efforts.

Congratulations to Carol Reynolds Our 2018 AAUW Named Gift Honoree!

My mom, Carol Farnan Reynolds, was born and raised in Saratoga County and graduated from Schuylerville High School and the College of St. Rose with a Bachelor's Degree in Education.

She did her student teaching a Shenendehowa and her first teaching job was in Schenectady City School District.

She was married to Leo in 1958 and just celebrated her 60th wedding anniversary this past April 12th. After having her first child she continued to substitute teach in the area for about a decade and raised four children, and managed and operated a restaurant in the Catskill mountains during the summers for five years.

When her nest was empty she went back to work for 7 years as a counselor at The Diet Center, and then for a decade for the family business, Reynolds Tax Service. She has been a grandmother for 34 years and still gets called upon regularly for helping with the youngest of her 13 grandchildren. (Which you would think she would be done with by now!)

She has been an active member of AAUW for many years, especially the Varied Interest group, and (I know she was treasurer for several years, but you probably know the AAUW positions better than me). She has also been an active parishioner at St. Joseph's Church in Scotia from the Catholic Family Movement in the 1970s, to teaching religious education to teenagers in the 1980's right up to currently volunteering at the City Mission and being recently selected as a Trustee of St. Joseph's just this year.
